## PROJECT 3 CSS Zen Garden



The Beauty of CSS Design

### DESCRIPTION

Adhering to the rules of Dave Shea's CSS Zen Garden challenge (<http://csszengarden.com/>), design your own unique take on the layout using purely CSS. This project can be done alone or in pairs if you wish.

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Download** the XHTML for the CSS Zen Garden.
2. Construct an **external CSS file** and change the @import rule in the embedded style sheet of the Zen Garden CSS to point to it.
3. Using **only the CSS** and the ids and classes in the XHTML provided, layout your page design using positioning, floating or a combination of both (consult the layout chapter of your textbook for help with this).
4. Decide on appropriate **typographic treatment** for the design body text, links and headings (with due respect to readability and legibility – set base font styles on the body).
5. Select a **pleasing colour scheme** for the page and incorporate **background images for page elements** to add the necessary visuals to your layout (use image replacement where appropriate - <http://www.mezzoblue.com/tests/revised-image-replacement/>).
6. Above all, **you cannot change the XHTML** (with the exception of the @import rule that points to your CSS file). *This is a must.*
7. Be sure to consult any and all of the resources that you need at <http://csszengarden.com/>.

### TAKE IT FURTHER

1. Perhaps try some **experimental CSS3 styles** like box-shadow or rounded corners (<http://css3.info>) .
2. Try different **positioning** techniques for various elements on the page.

3. Build your page such that it is resizable and adapts to various text sizes and/or browser window sizes.
4. Anything else you can think of...

The design colour scheme is well thought out and applied effectively to both the typography and background colours and/or images.	/5
